UTILITY BOARD/COMMON COUNCIL Tuesday, March 12, 2024 5:30 P.M.

The Common Council and Utility Board of the City of Huntingburg met in joint session on Tuesday, March 12, 2024 at the hour of 5:30 P.M. in the Council Chambers of the Huntingburg City Hall at 508 E. Fourth Street, Huntingburg, Indiana. Members Kissling, Wehr, Bolte, Bounds and McPherron were physically present. This meeting was opened to the public, and made available to members of the public and the media streamed through the City of Huntingburg's YouTube channel accessed via the City of Huntingburg's website. Also present were Mayor Elkins, City Attorney Schneider and Clerk-Treasurer Dippel.

Mayor Elkins called the meeting to order.

A motion was made by Kissling, seconded by Bounds and carried to approve the minutes of the February 28, 2024 regular meeting.

A motion was made by Wehr, seconded by Bolte and carried to approve the claims as presented.

The Mayor updated the Council on the Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area (DORA) activities.

Attorney Schneider presented a proposed ordinance amending the Fire Department leadership process. He noted the Fire Chief and one Assistant Chief would be appointed by the Mayor, and subordinate officers would be appointed by the Fire Chief. The proposed ordinance adoption was recommended by the Huntingburg Board of Public Works and Safety.

A motion was made by Kissling, seconded by McPherron and carried to introduce Ordinance No. 2024-06 entitled:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 38.02 OF THE HUNTINGBURG MUNICIPAL CODE PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS AND OFFICERS

A motion was made by Kissling, seconded by Bolte and carried with unanimous consent to suspend the rules and consider the adoption of Ordinance No. 2024-06 at the same meeting it was introduced.

A motion was made by Kissling, seconded by Wehr and carried to adopt Ordinance No. 2024-06.

Upon call of roll for the adoption or rejection of Ordinance No. 2024-06 the vote being 5 ayes, 0 nays, in favor of adoption, Ordinance No. 2024-06 was duly passed and adopted this date at the hour of 5:36 p.m.

Clerk-Treasurer Dippel presented a submission of the Huntingburg Redevelopment Commission and the Huntingburg Redevelopment Authority required to be submitted to the Mayor, Common Council, Redevelopment Commission and Redevelopment Authority about the Incomes, Expenses, summary of bonds outstanding, along with the commissioner and officer of RDC and RDA and their wages for 2023. The submission also lists each parcel in each TIF. He noted the report was also sent to the DLGF through the Gateway system.

Dippel presented a proposed amended American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Spending Plan (Exhibit A). He noted that most projects were complete and that remaining money now needs to be reallocated. He noted all monies not spent to date have been reallocated to the Senior Center Project.

A motion was made by Kissling, seconded by McPherron and carried to approve the amended ARPA Spending Plan as presented.

Glen Kays, Leigh Pies and Cama Stillman, residents living in Hunters Crossing, addressed the Council with concerns of large fireworks being let off at inappropriate times. They requested the Council look into passing more restrictive fireworks restrictions than the current State law. Dates, times, special events and enforcement were discussed.

Maleah Dearing, of the Mayor's Youth Council, updated the Common Council about upcoming events.

There being no further business before the Council, a motion was made by Wehr, seconded by Bolte and carried to adjourn the meeting at 6:06 o'clock P.M.
